

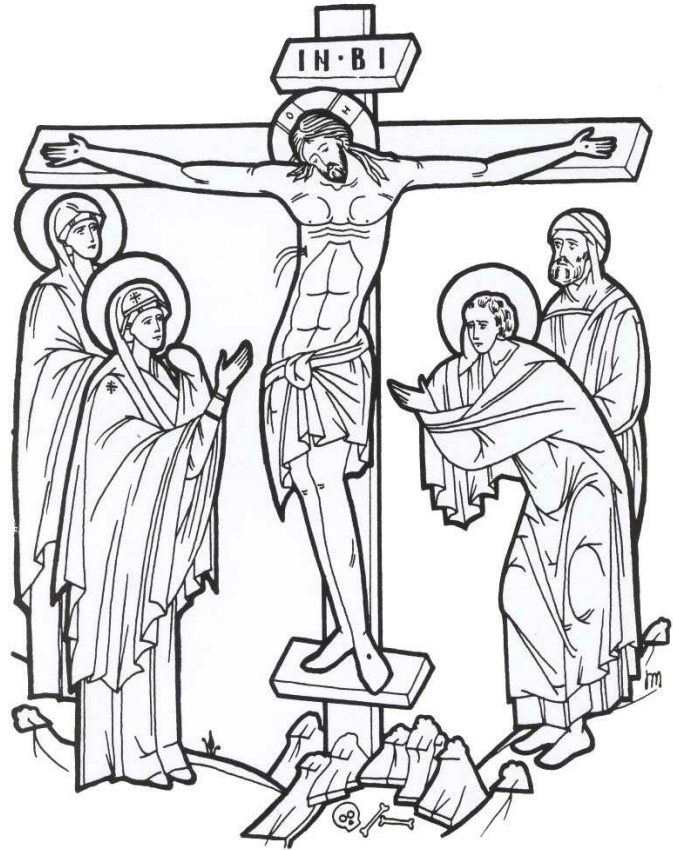
# JESUS DIED AND ROSE SO WE CAN BE WITH HIM
