

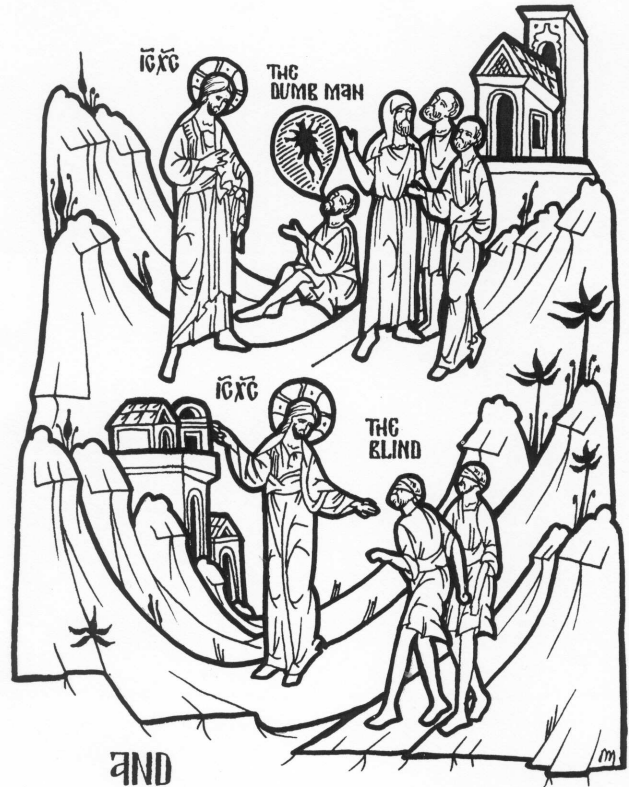
JESUS TEACHES AND HEALS

Then Jesus went through all the cities and villages, teaching, preaching, and healing.

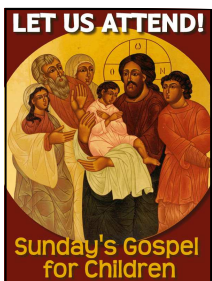

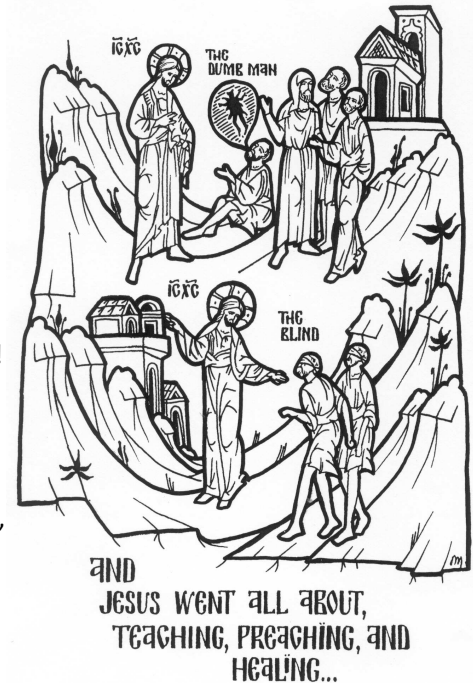
Jesus went in a house and the blind men followed. Jesus asked them, “Do you believe that I can heal you?”

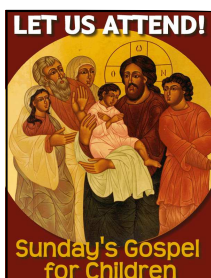
Then Jesus went all over the countryside, teaching, preaching, and healing.
