

Teacher Training I Coursework

Overview of Orthodoxy

The basic tenets of our faith that undergird the revision project are provided in an interactive course that models a variety of teaching techniques.

Introduction to Teaching

Effective teaching is a combination of planning and management. Topics include: how to write a measurable objective, five components of a lesson plan and ideas for the presentation of each, and how to manage a positive, productive classroom.

Curriculum and Resources

An overview of “best resources” will be provided. Websites valuable for Orthodox education will be explored. Teachers may receive special instruction in *The Way, The Truth, and The Life*, and *The Scribe*.

ARCHPRIEST DANIEL KOVALAK, received his B.A. from American International College in Springfield Massachusetts, and his Diploma in Orthodox Theology from Saint Tikhon’s Seminary. Upon completing his education, he was assigned to Miami, Florida where, in addition to his pastoral duties, he worked with Fr. George Gladky to plant several missions throughout the south, including a parish in Jackson/Clinton, Mississippi.

After two years in Miami, Fr. Kovalak relocated to Williamsport, Pennsylvania, where he founded Holy Cross parish. In 1995, joined the faculty of St. Tikhon’s Seminary teaching Missions and Evangelization. He was the keynote speaker for the recent Assembly of the Diocese of the South, and was a presenter at the 2005 All-American Council, on the topic of Evangelism.

Fr. Kovalak has written numerous articles for *The Orthodox Church, Alive in Christ* and several other publications, including the *OCA Resource Handbook*. He is an in-demand guest lecturer and retreat speaker.

“Sharing Your Faith” Coursework

Overview of Evangelism

For Orthodox Christians who have been entrusted with the life-giving ancient faith, sharing Orthodoxy is not optional. The course will discuss what

adults can and must do, to overcome difficulties in sharing their faith.

Orthodoxy & Catholicism

The two traditions share a 1000-year common history. The division, or “Great Schism,” will be touched upon, but the focus of the course will be on current similarities and differences.

Orthodoxy & Protestantism

Several of the groups that accept the title of “Protestant,” will be examined and their beliefs with Orthodox positions on the sacraments, the priesthood, and other major issues will be discussed.

If a certificate is not desired, participants may also choose to attend courses of interest from either track. Course descriptions are on the back of the brochure.

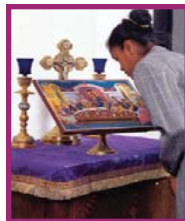
This event is an abridged version of the fall Orthodox Institute at Antiochian Village, an opportunity for continuing education for Church School Staff and interested adults.
