I am afflicted and humbled exceedingly, I have roared from the groaning of my heart. O Lord, before Thee is all my desire, and my groaning is not hid from Thee. My heart is troubled, my strength hath failed me; and the light of mine eyes, even this is not with me. My friends and my neighbors drew nigh over against me and stood, and my nearest of kin stood afar off. And they that sought after my soul used violence; and they that sought evils for me spake vain things, and craftiness all the day long did they meditate. But as for me, like a deaf man I heard them not, and was as a speechless man that openeth not his mouth. And I became as a man that heareth not, and that hath in his mouth no reproofs. For in Thee have I hoped, O Lord; Thou wilt hearken unto me, O Lord my God. For I said: Let never mine enemies rejoice over me; yea, when my feet were shaken, those men spake boastful words against me. For I am ready for scourges, and my sorrow is continually before me. For I will declare mine iniquity, and I will take heed concerning my sin. But mine enemies live and are made stronger than I, and they that hated me unjustly are multiplied. A poor man am I, and in troubles from my youth; yea, having been exalted, I was humbled and brought to distress. Thy furies have passed upon me, and Thy terrors have sorely troubled me. They came round about me like water, all the day long they compassed me about together. Thou hast removed afar from me friend and neighbor, and mine acquaintances because of my misery.

TO BE READ FROM THE BEAUTIFUL GATE

Restore unto me the joy of Thy salvation, and with Thy governing Spirit establish me. I shall teach transgressors Thy ways, and the ungodly shall turn back unto Thee. Deliver me from blood-guiltiness, O God, Thou God of my salvation; my tongue shall rejoice in Thy righteousness. O Lord, Thou shalt open my lips, and my mouth shall declare Thy praise. For if Thou hadst desired sacrifice, I had given it; with whole-burnt offerings Thou shalt not be pleased. A sacrifice unto God is a broken spirit; a heart that is broken and humbled God will not despise. Do good, O Lord, in Thy good pleasure unto Zion, and let the walls of Jerusalem be build up. Then shalt Thou be pleased with a sacrifice of righteousness, with oblation and whole-burnt offerings. Then shall they offer bullocks upon Thine altar.

the Wonderworkers; of our fathers among the saints Tikhon, patriarch of Moscow and Raphael, bishop of Brooklyn; of the holy, glorious, great-martyrs, George the Trophy-bearer, Demetrios the Myrrh-streamer, Theodore the Soldier, Theodore the General, and Menas the Wonderworker; of the hieromartyrs Ignatius the God-bearer of Antioch, Charalampos and Eleutherios; of the holy, glorious great women martyrs, Thekla, Barbara, Anastasia, Katherine, Kyriaki, Photeini, Marina, Paraskeva and Irene; of the holy, glorious, right-victorious martyrs; of our venerable and God-bearing fathers who shone in the ascetic life; *of Saint N., the patron and protector of this holy community*; of the holy and righteous ancestors of God, Joachim and Anna; of the Hieromartyr Cornelius the centurion; Venerable Hierotheos the Younger of Iviron monastery on Athos; Great-martyr Ketevan, queen of Georgia; and the Six Martyrs at Tomi in Romania, whose memory we celebrate today, and of all the saints: we beseech Thee, O most merciful Lord, hearken unto the petitions of us sinners who make our supplications unto Thee, and have mercy upon us.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (*twelve times*)

Priest: Through the mercies and compassions and love for mankind of Thine Only-begotten Son, with Whom Thou art blessed, together with Thine all-holy, and good, and life-giving Spirit: now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

KONTAKION AND OIKOS FOR THE CONSECRATION (Plain Reading)

The Church is shone to be a many-lighted heaven that doth shine a guiding light upon all them that do believe; wherein while standing, we cry aloud: Do Thou Thyself now establish this house, O Lord.

When the Word dwelt among us in the flesh, the Son of Thunder spake thus in his writings: We have radiantly beheld the glory which the Son hath from the Father in the grace of truth. And as many of us as have received Him with faith, to all hath He given the power to become children of God; and we, who were born again not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, but have received increase by the Holy Spirit, have raised up this house of prayer, and cry out: Do Thou Thyself now establish this house, O Lord.

THE SYNAXARION (Plain Reading)

On September 13 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we celebrate the Fore-feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and commemorate the Consecration of the Church of the Holy Resurrection of Christ our God.

Verses

New Israel, fulfilling a law that is ancient,
Doth honor thy tomb, O Word, with this consecration.
On the thirteenth befell the consecration of the Resurrection's fane.

Holy Resurrection in Jerusalem is honored above all others. Constantine the Great constructed it at the place of Golgotha, where our Savior was crucified and buried, then arose. For a long time this place had been purposely buried beneath the earth by the Jews and heathen; furthermore, during the reign of Hadrian (117-138), a temple dedicated to Aphrodite was built over the site so that this sacred place might be even further desecrated and fall into utter oblivion. It was here that the Cross was hidden. However, at the command of the pious Emperor Constantine, excavations were made and the tokens of the saving Passion were found. It was here, then, that the very great

and magnificent temple named in honor of Christ God's Resurrection was built under the supervision of the blessed Helen, while Macarius was Archbishop of Jerusalem. Macarius exalted the venerable Cross and consecrated this temple in the year 336.

On this day, we also commemorate the Hieromartyr Cornelius the centurion; Venerable Hierotheos the Younger of Iviron monastery on Athos; Great-martyr Ketevan, queen of Georgia; and the Six Martyrs at Tomi in Romania. By the intercessions of Thy Saints, O Christ God, have mercy on us. Amen.

THE KATAVASIAS OF THE HOLY CROSS CANON IN TONE EIGHT

Ode 1. Verily, Moses having struck horizontally with his rod, cleaving the Red Sea and causing Israel to cross on foot, then having struck it transversely bringing it together over Pharaoh and his chariots, did trace the Cross, thus symbolizing that invincible weapon. Wherefore, do we praise Christ our God, for that He hath been glorified.

Ode 3. The rod is taken as a symbol of the mystery; for by its budding, it designateth the Priest. But now the tree of the Cross hath blossomed forth with might and steadfastness to the hitherto barren Church.

Ode 4. I have heard, O Lord, of the mystery of Thy dispensation, and have contemplated Thy works. Wherefore, have I glorified Thy Godhead.

Ode 5. O thou thrice-blessed Tree, on which the Lord Christ the King was stretched, and through which he who beguiled by the tree fell, having been beguiled by God Who was nailed upon thee in the flesh, Who granteth peace unto our souls.

Ode 6. When Jonah in the belly of the whale did stretch forth his hands in the form of a cross, he did foreshadow clearly the Passion of salvation; and when he came out on the third day, he did symbolize the world-transcending Resurrection of Christ, Who was crucified in the flesh, and illuminating the world by His third-day Resurrection.

Ode 7. The mad command of the infidel tyrant hath shaken the nations, breathing forth threats and blasphemies loathed of God. But the three youths were not terrified by the bestial terror, nor the consuming fire; for being together amidst the fire blown forth by a dewy breeze, they were singing: O Thou exceedingly praised, blessed art Thou, God of our Fathers.

We praise, we bless, and we worship the Lord.

Ode 8. O ye youths, equal in number to the Trinity, bless ye God the Father and Creator; praise the Word which did condescend and turn the fire to a dewy breeze; and exalt more and more the all-holy Spirit, Who giveth life to all forevermore.

Deacon: The Theotokos and Mother of the Light let us honor and magnify in song.

MAGNIFICATIONS IN TONE EIGHT

Choir: My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior.

Refrain: More honorable than the Cherubim, and more glorious beyond compare than the Seraphim, thou who without corruption barest God the Word, and art truly Theotokos, we magnify thee. (*Repeat after each Verse.*)

+ For He hath regarded the lowliness of His handmaiden; for behold from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. (*Refrain*)

- + For He that is mighty hath magnified me, and holy is His Name; and His mercy is on them that fear Him, throughout all generations. (*Refrain*)
- + He hath showed strength with His arm; He hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. (*Refrain*)
- + He hath put down the mighty from their seat, and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the empty with good things, and the rich hath He sent empty away. (*Refrain*)
- + He remembering His mercy hath helped His servant Israel, as He promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed forever. (*Refrain*)

Ode 9. Thou art the mystical paradise, O Theotokos; for that thou, being untilled, didst bud forth Christ, by Whom was planted on earth the life-giving tree of the Cross. Wherefore, as we adore it being elevated, we magnify thee.

THE LITTLE LITANY

- Deacon: Again and again, in peace, let us pray to the Lord.
- Choir: Lord, have mercy.
- Deacon: Help us; save us; have mercy on us; and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.
- Choir: Lord, have mercy.
- Deacon: Calling to remembrance our all-holy, immaculate, most-blessed and glorious Lady Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, with all the saints: let us commend ourselves and each other, and all our life unto Christ our God.
- Choir: To Thee, O Lord.
- Priest: For all the powers of Heaven praise Thee, and unto Thee do they ascribe glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: now and ever, and unto ages of ages.
- Choir: Amen.

EXAPOSTELARIA & THEOTOKION FOR THE CONSECRATION IN TONE TWO

(**Upon that mount in Galilee**)

Willingly lifted on the Cross * on Golgotha aforesaid, * the Lord made all creation new, * while working our salvation. * Laid in a tomb that received Life, * as God He rose the third day, * the consecration of Whose bright * and august Resurrection * we all now keep * as a joyous feast and commemoration * with all the incorporeal * orders of holy Angels.

The Lord God took flesh willingly, * and through the Cross He suffered, * He wrought salvation in the midst * of the earth, to accomplish * the world's divine restoration; * and though a tomb received Him, * the third day He arose again, * and to give us an earnest * of endless life, * He gave His Arising, whose consecration * we now observe with fervent faith * with God's unnumbered Angels.

In joy we cry aloud to thee: * Rejoice, O holy Virgin; * rejoice, redemption from the curse * that fell on Eve and Adam; * rejoice, for through thee the essence * of mortals is raised up to * the glory of thy Son and God, * which transcendeth the whole world; * rejoice, through whom * He is ever worshipped and praised, O Mary, * by Angels in the Heavens' heights, * O all-hymned Theotokos.

AINOI (PRAISES) IN TONE FOUR

Choir: Let everything that hath breath, praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord from the heavens: praise Him in the heights. To Thee, O God, is due our song.
Choir: Praise ye Him, all His angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. To Thee, O God, is due our song.

For the Consecration in Tone Four (**Unto them that fear Thee**)

Verse 1. This glory shall be to all His saints.

On this day with joy of heart is consecrated the ven'erable * and divine and most luminous * and sacred and splendid house * of Christ's Resurrection; * and the Holy Sepulcher giveth life unto the world *and doth provide it with an immortal spring. * It wellet up with streams of grace, it gusheth rivers of miracles, * and doth grant healings unto them * that now faithfully sing its praise.

Verse 2. Praise God in His sanctuary; praise Him in the firmament of His power.

Now the brightly beaming splendor from on high hath shone lightning-like * and enlightened all things that be. * With faith then, come let us all * laud the Resurrection * of Christ our Creator; and let us celebrate with hymns * the life-bestowing and godly festival * of this most sacred consecration; and with psalms, let us shout with joy, * that we find our Redeemer Christ * and our Lord to be merciful.

Verse 3. Praise Him for His mighty acts; praise Him according to His excellent greatness.

Since we long to see the holy scepter of the Cross raised on high * in the midst of the earth today, * with care let us cleanse our souls, * let our minds flash brightly; * let us shine with light, and illuminated brilliantly * with a divine power, sing the praise of Christ, * Who by His hallowed Wood freely bestoweth holiness on all them * that extol it with ardent love * and who honor it faithfully.

Also for the Consecration in Tone One

Verse 4. Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; praise Him with the psaltery and harp.

Be consecrated, be consecrated, O new Jerusalem, for thy Light is come, and the glory of the Lord hath arisen upon thee. This house hath the Father built; this house hath the Son made steadfast; this house hath the Holy Spirit inaugurated, Who enlighteneth, establisheth and sanctifieth our souls.

Verse 5. Praise Him with the timbrel and dance; praise Him with stringed instruments and organs.

In time past, when Solomon consecrated the temple, he offered sacrifices of dumb beasts and whole-burnt offerings, O Lord; but since Thou hast been well-pleased, O Savior, that those types should cease, and that the truth be made known, the ends of the world offer unbloody sacrifices unto Thy glory; for since Thou art the Master of all things, Thou sanctifiest all things by the Holy Spirit.

Also for the Consecration in Tone Four

Verse 6. Praise Him upon the loud cymbals: praise Him upon the high-sounding cymbals. Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord.

Today the Church of the nations is consecrated with the precious and life-streaming Blood that came forth from the immaculate and undefiled side of Christ our God, Who was incarnate of the holy Virgin. Therefore, as we the choirs of the faithful gather, let us glorify the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, the one Godhead that hath dominion over all.

THE DOXASTICON FOR THE CONSECRATION IN TONE THREE

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Come to thyself, O man; be made new instead of old, and celebrate the renewal and consecration of thy soul. While there is time, let thy life be consecrated in all its endeavors. Old things are passed away; behold, all things are made new. Bring forth this fruit on the feast: be changed with the good change. Thus is a man consecrated; thus is the day of the consecration honored.

THE DOXASTICON FOR THE FORE-FEAST IN TONE THREE

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

O Christ our God, Who didst accept Thy voluntary crucifixion for the general resurrection of the race of man, and didst redden Thine own fingers with the vermilion ink of Thy blood, wishing, in Thy love for mankind, to sign by the pen of the Cross the royal decree of our forgiveness: Do not disdain us who are again in danger of falling away from Thee. But have compassion on Thy people that is in peril, O Long-suffering One, and arise, make war against them that war against us, since Thou art almighty.

- + Glory to Thee, Who hast shown us the Light; Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will among men.

- + For Thou only art holy, Thou only art the Lord, O Jesus Christ, to the Glory of God the Father. Amen.
